recycled paper art

Magazine Art

This is so simple to make yet so cute!


Material

- Magazine
- Cardboard (size depends on what you want to make, either a greeting card or a wall hanging).
- Choose an image you want, See next page for some ideas to use.
- Magazine Strips
- Paintbrushes
- Glue (Cold Glue)

Steps:

- First you cut out your shape and sketch in onto your cardboard.
- Start at any end of your art, but I recommend starting with the smaller tricky parts because you can layer over them later
- Take a strip of magazine and cut the top and bottom to make it fit the section properly
- Put a layer of thin glue in your shape, make sure not to have too much glue.
- Lay down your strip of paper on the desired area and take your paintbrush and paint over the strip allowing it to stick (don't worry the glue will dry clear)
- Continue Step until your whole artwork is covered with strips
- Let the whole artwork dry and then cover the whole cardboard with layer of glue so it is sealed and has a shiny finish!





recycled paper art

For this project use

Old magazines

Cardboard (A4 or A3 size) (Try recycled boxes) size depends on you.

Black Cardboard to make your template

Glue sticks

Craft blade

Cutting mat or something to cut your paper art on





Cut strips of magazine pages, folding them lengthwise and gluing them down with your glue stick.

Glue them down with the folded edges approximately 1 cm apart.

Try using coloured pages

Trim your edges using a craft knife, to match the end of of the cardboard.







Trim your black carboard paper to match your picture. Then trim and additional 2.5cm off the bottom so that the finished art will show all the coloured strips along the bottom.

Draw your pattern on the paper and using a craft knife to cut out your picture.



Depending on how you are cutting it out, you might have to glue your paper down in sections.






Once you are done putting together you can either frame it, or why not try framing it with duct tape around the edges to look like a frame.

An there you have it, a nice gift to give to someone else.





stick family

MATERIALS:

- Sticks Y shape stick for the body and a shorter straight one for the arms
- Coloured yarn or wool
- Googly eyes

HOW TO:

Collect some Y shape sticks and some smaller straight sticks. I cut them to size using a small saw.



Place your straight stick across the Y shaped stick to make the arms and begin wrapping yarn to hold it in place. Come our Scouters you know what knot to use







We wrapped around different coloured yarns to make their 'clothes'.

To make the hair wrap yarn around your hand or a piece of cardboard, remove the bundle of yarn and tie a knot around the middle.

Trim the looped ends of the yarn to make the hair.

Cut a mouth with a craft knife and glue on eyes and hair using a hot glue gun or cold glue

There you have your own stick family, how awesome is this as another form of puppets. Now all it take is some imagination.

How to Upcycle Old Magazines into Wall Art







Materials:

- magazines
- canvas/wood/board
- hot glue sticks
- pattern – tape
- Tools:
- hot glue gun
- scissors

Instructions

- 1. Print and cut out a silhouetted shape.
- 2. Tear out a bunch of magazine pages. Fold in half twice to get four small rectangles.
- 3. Start to roll! Try to keep the magazine rolls as tight as possible. Tape the end to avoid it from unravelling.
- 4. Hot glue your magazine roll-ups to your silhouette. Once the silhouette is covered, trim off the extra magazine pieces. This will reveal your silhouetted shape.
- 5. Glue magazine silhouette to your wood board.

Time to get started! Cut out your silhouette from scrap paper.







Next you want to tear up those pages. First fold the page in half and tear down the centre, then fold in half again and tear. Now you will have tons of small rectangles ready to roll.

Start at the edge and tightly roll the page into a cylinder. Secure the end with a piece of tape.

You're going to need a lot of roll-ups. Try to pick magazine pages that have fun colors!

Using the hot glue gun, glue the roll ups onto your silhouette. Don't worry about covering the smaller sections. Once you trim off the excess roll up you will have smaller pieces that will fit into those tiny spaces quite perfectly!





Trim the excess magazine to reveal your silhouetted shape. Remember, don't throw away those tiny pieces.

Patch up those paws!






Time to mount your silhouette to a board. We used a thin wood board that we found at the art store. You can use wood, cardboard, illustrator board, etc. You could even go directly on the wall.






This bear is ready to hang.




